## Music and Pilgrimage

This weekend, the Lay Ministers Enrichment (LME) Ministry hosted a daylong seminar on sacred music. The presenter gave an overview of sacred music from its beginnings to the present day. The program inspired me to share with you a powerful experience that I had last June when I was able to fulfill my dream of walking the *Camino* to Santiago de Compostela in northwestern Spain. This is an unforgettable and unique pilgrimage; approached with an open heart, it provides spiritual enrichment and changes to the way we look at life.

In preparing for my journey, I gathered a considerable amount of sacred music to listen to while walking and reflecting. The *Camino* has a long association with both secular and sacred music, which spans over a thousand years. A substantial portion of the music is religious, but there are also popular and secular tunes that have been sung, played, danced and listened to by pilgrims. One of my favorites, Gregorian Chant, has been associated with the monks of the monastery of Santo Domingo de Silos, near the *Camino* route in Burgos Province. Another, *Stabat Mater Dolorosa*, lamentations of the Virgin at the foot of the Cross, was frequently set to music related to the *Camino* from the late medieval period well into the 20th century.

Sacred music is the perfect companion for the "French Route" of the *Camino*, which starts at Saint Jean Pied de Port, in France, and passes through Galicia before reaching the town of Santiago de Compostela. Religious hymns seem to have been tailor-made for the appreciation of the region's beauty. The *Stabat Mater*, arias and laments all are woven into the history of medieval villages along the route. Listening to my own music made me imagine the celebrations attended by the pilgrims who walked the way in days past. The songs are different but the music of the church is the centerpiece of it all.

In addition to proving a gratifying listening experience, sacred music was also a comforting voice that provided inspiration, and urged me to continue when I was feeling tired and facing challenging climbs in order to reach my next stop.

My most memorable recollection of sacred music during the journey occurred on my way to the town of Sarria. A fellow traveler recommended that I take a different route than the normal, shorter one and go by way of the town of Samos, to see the monastery there. He warned that the alternate walk was longer and more difficult, but promised that it was worth the effort. And right he was! The monastery (at right) dates to the sixth century and was a school of theology and philosophy. At its height, it controlled all the dioceses in the Lugo Valley. I could not miss the opportunity of seeing such an important site.

Through the 20-kilometer trek, the Gregorian Chant that I was listening to brought the scenery to life and, coming close to the goal, while hearing these soulful voices, I was treated to a breathtaking panoramic view of the town and the monastery itself. Mere words do not do justice to the magnificent for



and the monastery itself. Mere words do not do justice to the magnificent frescos, statues and ah! the inner courtyard of the monastery. The music brought to my mind and heart what words could not express.

It would take more than this essay to fully convey all the special moments when sacred music played a vital role in my pilgrimage experience. I encourage you to include listening to sacred music in your own prayer practice—in your moments of walking or sitting in contemplation—and (re)discover its power to lift the soul.

The LME program this weekend was enlightening and very satisfying. I encourage you to attend our next LME event on April 25th.


