The Lectures at St. Ignatius | 2019-2020

t is time to announce this year's Lecture Series. But first, some background.

In February 2019, the Superior General of the Jesuits, Fr. Arturo Sosa, S.J., promulgated "The Universal Apostolic Preferences of the Society of Jesus, 2019–2029." They are four working fields to which the Society will pay special attention and in which it will invest a significant portion of its resources over the next few years.

The Preferences give a horizon, a point of reference to the whole Society of Jesus. They capture our imaginations and awaken our desires. They unite us in our mission. They are vital for the world today.

The Four Universal Apostolic Preferences are:

To show the way to God through the Spiritual Exercises and discernment;

To walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world, those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice; To accompany young people in the creation of a hope-filled future;

To collaborate in the care of our Common Home.

Our Lectures at St. Ignatius this year will have as their central themes these four "points of reference," each presented by a prominent expert in the respective field.

The **first** lecture will be given by professor J. Patrick Hornbeck II, Chair of the Department of Theology at Fordham University. Professor Hornbeck is also Special Assistant to the Provost for Strategic Planning at Fordham. The title of his lecture is, "Consolations and Desolations in Jesuit Higher Education Today." Rightly is this the first lecture, as without this prayerful attitude the other preferences will not bear fruit.

The **second** lecture will be given by Mr. William C. Moyers, Vice-President of Public Affairs and Community Relations for Hazelden Betty Ford. As the organization's public advocate since 1996 he carries the messages about addiction, treatment and recovery. An inspiring and powerful speaker, Mr. Moyers will address the challenges of addiction and reconciliation. The title of his lecture is, "Freedom From Addiction."

The **third** lecture will be given by Sister Nancy Downing, C.N.D., Executive Director of Covenant House in New York. For over 40 years homeless youth have found safety and a shelter from the streets at Covenant House. More than a shelter, Covenant House stands as a powerful human rights movement for homeless and trafficked youth. Sister Downing will speak on, "Journeying With Youth."

The **fourth** and final lecture in the series, on the care of our Common Home, is at the present time still being finalized. Be prepared for a rousing evening—in word and gesture, in song and dance—in celebration of our earth, in the spirit of Saint Francis of Assisi's *The Canticle of Creation* and Pope Francis' Encyclical *Laudato sì*.

The lectures will be held Monday evenings at 7:00 PM, in Wallace Hall. All will be followed by refreshments. Please save the following dates:

In his letter promulgating the Universal Apostolic Preferences, Father Sosa wrote, "Our desire has been to find the best way to collaborate in the Lord's mission, the best way to serve the Church at this time, the best contribution we can make with what we are and have, seeking to do what is for the greater divine service and the more universal good."

The Lectures at St. Ignatius 2019–2020 will bring to our parish significant opportunities for education, reflection, inspiration, and action. Accompanying each lecture, a corresponding Parish Bulletin Essay will expand on the specific material. Blessings!
