Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Some Thoughts on Christ as King in this Season of Thanksgiving

Jesus Christ as King of all the people who live, have lived, and will live upon the earth. For us who believe that Jesus is both God and one of us, he is also King of the universe and what a king! He was before the world was and all that is was made through him. Yet, he did not insist upon our acknowledging his prerogatives as universal king. Jesus is a king who came not to be served, but to be of service. He never compelled people to follow him but invited people to enter into a deep friendship with him. Sometimes this invitation is to explicit Christian faith; sometimes it is the graced longing of the individual human heart faithfully followed that brings a person to him. In order that he might be accessible to us, he did not cling to his divinity but accepted our humanity in its totality. This he did in such a way that the humanity we share with him and freely accept, as he did, in its totality, is the very means of our sharing in his divinity. What God has done for us in Jesus is most certainly cause for rejoicing, praise, and thanksgiving. Indeed there is no more perfect time of year for us to be thankful.

This Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. A person does not have to be an expert in the works of Shakespeare to feel the passion and understand the meaning of these words spoken by King Lear in the play, named after him: "How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is to have a thankless child!" Now, we, you and I, are the children of God, and the Thanksgiving Season appears to be an excellent opportunity for us to reflect on what kind of children we have been and what has been our response to all that God has given us.

The trouble with this, of course, is that it can move our attention away from focusing on God, the giver of gifts, to focusing on ourselves. We can spend our time exclusively in counting our blessings and passing judgment on the adequacy of our response to all we have been given. If we do this, however, we risk merely thinking about ourselves and on our responses to God's generosity, and we can foster an easy self-indulgent introspection. As an antidote to this inclination, I would suggest postponing self-examination in favor of merely enjoying what has been given. After all, in the first moment, the Divine Lover does not give us gifts to elicit our praise or extort our gratitude, but that we might delight in the gifts themselves. God, as it were, would have us play like little children with these signs of God's affection, to rejoice in them, and to use them for our delight and to share them with others. Then, when it is time to turn our hearts to God in thanksgiving, we will be doing so with a deeper appreciation of the gifts and of the giver. For in Jesus they are one. At that point our gratitude will be authentic and we might even be inclined to pray these words of George Herbert:

Thou, that hast given so much to me, Give one thing more: a grateful heart.... Not thankful when it pleaseth me; As if Thy blessings had spare days: But such a heart whose pulse may be Thy praise.


