First Sunday of Advent

Waiting

he Church's season of Advent begins today. Advent is often described as a time of waiting. For children, it may principally be about waiting for Christmas. For Santa Claus. And if you bring up Jesus—"We're waiting for Jesus"— you may be reminded by your child, "But you told us he was already here!"

And so he is. He is here in the supreme sacrament of the Eucharist which we call his real presence. But God is truly present in the word of scripture as well, the word of the Lord. The word of scripture actually does announce him, presents him as teacher, and conveys his mercy and forgiveness of sinners. He is also here in humanity, in the neighbor. He is especially present in the neighbor who is hungry and you feed; who is homeless and you shelter; who is sick and you help to heal. And one more place: God, you can tell a child, is within you. The church is the building we call God's House, but each of us is really a house of God, or what St. Paul calls a Temple of the Holy Spirit. Yes, God, Jesus is already here.



So what are we waiting for in Advent if Jesus is already here? We're waiting for an anniversary, for a birthday party, a celebration of when he first came in the flesh, in our flesh, and into our world. But much more needs to be said. We are waiting for a fresh coming, so to speak, of Jesus into our lives.

How does this happen? How does God come? This has been answered by Christian theologians and writers in spirituality in many different ways over many centuries. Let me offer my short answer. I think the short answer is that God comes wherever true love is, love that is given or received. When God became human in Jesus Christ, the people who knew him best were the twelve apostles who were his closest friends in the final three years of his life. One of them, John, "the disciple Jesus loved" (John 13:23) gives us the

very best description of Jesus in the New Testament: "God is love" (1 John 4:8). It is fair to say that God is love and nothing but love. And love shows itself in many different ways in many different people. I am reminded of the verse from Gerard Manley Hopkins' poem As Kingfishers Catch Fire: "For Christ plays in ten thousand places, lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his, to the Father through the features of men's faces."

What love brings is best revealed by Saint Paul in his letter to the Christians of Galatia. Paul writes that the fruit of the Sprit is "joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23). Whenever I observe these qualities in someone, I know God surely is working there. In his Rules for the Discernment of Spirits, Saint Ignatius writes that the characteristic gift of God is inner peace. In Luke's account of the birth of Jesus, a great throng of angels sing: "Glory to God in the highest and peace to men who enjoy his favor." At Mass, the initial greeting is frequently: "Peace be with you." And at every Mass there is a prayer before the Sign of Peace that begins: "Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you." Inner peace is God's great gift to us.

Over the next several weeks of Advent, the one constant message we will be hearing in scripture is this: "The Lord is coming! The Lord is coming!" This is the promise that resounds through a thousand years of Hebrew scriptures, a promise we believe has been fulfilled with the birth of Christ. With anticipation, we await the anniversary of that coming, and we look forward to his coming again as we pray in the Creed every Sunday: "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end." As we look to the future, our hope is to be convinced that it is the presence of God with us right now that matters most, even though we still speak of a Christ who is to come.
