Concerts at St. Ignatius, Park Avenue...An Update!

In a normal year, Concerts at St. Ignatius would be cruising through the first part of our season, with two or three productions already done, and we'd be looking forward to our Christmas festivities. But nothing else is normal this year, and like all other arts organizations, we've had to make a few adjustments. The three main reasons for this are:

- 1. A lack of consensus regarding the safety of live ensemble performances has persisted through the summer and into the fall. The basic pattern is that many large ensembles, including the New York Philharmonic, have canceled their entire seasons, while many smaller ensembles are now performing livestreamed concerts with physically distanced performers. Other groups are performing virtually by having each member record their own part from home. All video files are then sent to an editor, who knits it all together to make it look like a Zoom meeting. For most ensembles, including the Choir of St. Ignatius Loyola, the best course of action simply wasn't clear. It still isn't, and in many respects, we are working month to month, with new realities developing constantly.
- 2. Our guiding principle at the church has been abundant caution. While we are open for in-person weekend Masses, the only live singing is done by a cantor. For the foreseeable future, there will be no live ensemble music at St. Ignatius.
- 3. For obvious reasons, both the church and the concert series are experiencing depressed revenue, so it was only recently that we were able to determine what was possible programmatically, based on modified revenue projections.

These are all challenges, to be sure, but the history of the performing arts is rife with interruptions and "workarounds". If anyone can find a way through difficult circumstances, it will be the artists!

With that in mind, and with the holiday season right around the corner, we are pleased to announce that the Christmas tradition at St. Ignatius will continue, in the form of two online virtual concerts you may view from the comfort of your home:
