Christmas Message from Fr. Arturo Sosa, S.J., Superior General of the Society of Jesus

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Jesuits, Companions in the Mission, Dear Members of the Ignatian Family,

hristmas offers us the opportunity to find meaning in the difficulties that the whole of humanity has experienced during this seemingly endless year of 2020. The COVID-19 pandemic comes first to mind, but it cannot make us forget the consequences of wars or the various faces of violence. Nor can it make us forget the inequalities that leave millions of children without food, without school, or the international unrest that expels millions of people from their homes to migrate in search of a better life.

Christmas does not hide the difficulties, but allows us to see them with new eyes and to awaken our sensitivity to the abundant testimonies of life that arise in the midst of the storm. May Joseph and Mary help us to see reality from their experience of the God who manifests Himself in an unsuspected way, because for Him nothing is impossible.

May Christmas draw the gaze of each one of you to the wonder of God incarnate in the beauty of a child born to free human history from selfishness and oppression. May it open our eyes to see God Incarnate everywhere, in the heart of the world, and may it also invite us to raise our eyes to heaven in thanksgiving for the Incarnation, the presence of the Emmanuel, God among us.

Merry Christmas! May Joseph and Mary be with you! May the good Lord fill you with His blessings!
